

The Gins Tasting set was found by member Graham Ramsay and posted on Facebook. The other bottles were found by me during lockdown.






I have to admit to never having heard of any of these gins. Nice find Graham.



I love the Prohibition flasks. The first two pictures are front and back views of Original Aged Gin, 100ml. The third photo is Shiraz Barrel Strength Aged Gin, 100ml. It has a back label similar to the Original. The company comes from Adelaide, South Australia. The Original is on sale at A\$30 and, bizarrely, the Barrel Strength at A\$26.



Baldwin Distilling Company is from Canberra, Australia's bullshit capital. These Moonshine bottles are 50ml not 700ml as it says on the label (accidental I'm sure, not bullshit!). They were being sold at A\$8 each.





Patient Wolf Melbourne Dry Gin is from Melbourne (what a surprise). They want A\$20 for this bottle. Mr Black is a distillery on the central Coast of NSW. The bottle is on sale at A\$8. Arktika is a Russian style vodka that sells for A\$6. The company is based in the Melbourne area.



# SPANISH BRANDY PT.2

#### DOMECQ

Domecq was founded in 1730 as a sherry producer. It produced Spain's first modern brandy in 1874 and called it Fundador. This was an apt name as it translates as founder. It is still a very popular brandy and sold in many countries. For a basic brandy it has less fruit added than similar graded brandies. It is aged for three years before bottling.



Domecq opened a few distilleries in Colombia, Venezuela and Brazil as well as one in Mexico. The Mexican distillery produces



seven million cases of brandy annually making it the biggest brandy distillery in the world. Presidente is their brand name.

At the top end of the market comes Carlos 1. This quality brandy first appeared in 1889 when some old barrels were found at the back of the warehouse. This is a pure brandy with no added flavourings and is graded Gran Reserva.



In 1994 the company merged with British company, Allied Lyons to become Allied Domecq. In 2007 Allied Domecq was bought jointly by Fortune Brands (better known as Jim Beam and later acquired by Suntory to become Beam Suntory) and Pernod Ricard. The assets were split up between the two purchasers with Domecq going to Fortune Brands. Some of the Domecq brands were later on-sold. In 2015 Fundador was bought by Emperador of the Philippines (they also own Whyte & Mackay and Terry Brandy), Osborne bought Carlos 1 and González Byass bought Presidente. When one of these global conglomerates buy another company they may end up with two brands with similar markets. They then sell one of the brands to another giant who also buy the trade names, usually the stock and aften the production facilities.



#### **BOBADILLA**

The Bobadilla family firm started life in the early 1930's as sherry producers. Their most famous brandy is 103. The name comes from the 103 days that the expedition led by the Portuguese navigator Magellan took to circumnavigate the globe. Unfortunately he did not complete the trip as he died near the Philippines. The white label is the lighter of the two brandies and aged for three years. The black label is aged for five years. The company is now owned by Osborne but run as a separate entity.

#### **GONZALES BYASS**

The company was founded in 1835 following a partnership between a Spaniard and an



Englishman. It is still family owned, which is amazing considering the upheavals that affected the sherry industry in the early 1970's.

They started life as sherry producers and their most famous brand is Tio Pepe. Brandy production started around 1885. Their entry level brandy is Soberano which is aged for one year. It is Spain's biggest selling brandy and makes up about 90% of the company production. The quality of Soberano can be guessed at as it is often sold attached to a can of coke.

The next level up is Insuperable which is aged for three years. The top level is Lepanto which is aged for twelve years. It first appeared in 1896 when some old barrels were found at the back of the warehouse. They must have poor quality auditors in Spain. Unusually for Spain, it is made from 100% Palomino grapes. It is rated the top brandy in Jerez and is often likened to a VSOP cognac.

In the next issue we will move up to Catalonia.

# HISTORICAL FIGURES #7N THE POPE


Yes, I know that I am cheating a bit but it seemed a waste to do an article on one Pope when we have three that miniatures have been made for. So we have here, John XXIII 1958-1963, Paul VI 1963-1978 & John Paul II 1978-2005. If you do not know who the Pope is, where have you been hiding all these years?







The two busts are of Pope John XXIII, the first from Borghini and the second from Old Store, both from Italy. The





flask, from Valenti (also Italy), also features John Paul II with Vatican Square & St. Peters on the reverse. The two jugs feature Paul VI. The jugs, from Portugal but an unknown maker, commemorate



visits, the first to Israel in 1964 and the second to Lady Fatima Shrine (Portugal) in 1967.



Citta Vaticano was made by (at least) Barfede and Fedeli of Italy. If buying Valenti flasks you need to look on both sides. On the left we have one with St.Peters on one side, the same as the one above, but the Trevi Fountain (in Rome not Vatican City) on the other.

To the right is another St. Peters, this one from Barfede but the same mould has also been used by Duca d'Asti. Below are two glass St. Peters and a Dome of St. Peters. The first St. Peters was made by Rocher Freres of France, the second is an unknown bottle. The dome is from Cherry Reatto of Italy and is one of a set of at least four with different contents.

I am sad to report the death of Malee Chin, wife of long time committee member Ken Chin and a regular attendee at club meetings. Malee had had poor health for many years and had cancer in recent years, which is what she died of. Sadly, Ken and their son Jeffrey were unable to comfort Malee in her last weeks. Although Ken is himself a Doctor, authorities would not make an exception of no hospital visits during the pandemic. Ken & Jeffrey were there for Malee's last few hours but she was non-responsive by then. It was a small funeral, attended by family only as in NZ we were restricted to 10 people only at a funeral at that time. A memorial service will be held later in the year.



All of the bottles I have to show you this time are from the October All Miniatures Auction by Whisky Auction UK. This was a spectacularly good auction in both the quality of the minis on offer and the prices fetched. I have so many bottles to show you but neither the time nor space to do them justice in one article. In miNiZ 125 & 126 I have shown you a mixture of non-whisky bottles and English bottles, including English bottled Scotch. I am going to show you auction results for Japanese and other non-Scotch whiskies here. In miNiZ128 I will show Scotch from the October auction and also from the auction that is taking place as I write this.

Let's start with Japan. Japan makes minis that sell for some very high prices as you will see. We will start at the top.

Hibiki 21 Year Old 50ml sold for £625 – rather expensive for two nips! By contrast the Suntory Royal 12 Year Old 50ml was a snip at £210

Kirin Seagram BAR Premium Whisky 50ml sold for  $\pounds$ 115. The next is difficult to read but says Suntory Pure Malt 8 Year Old 10cl. This sold for  $\pounds$ 110. Old Torys Whisky Anejo was bottled in Mexico in the

1960's. It is probably 50ml and sold for  $\pounds$ 200 – a staggering figure for a foreign bottled Japanese whisky, especially one in less than average condition. Finally on this page we have the Suntory VSOP Brandy Royal Violin Bottle. This is 70ml and fetched £45.

Across the top of the next page we have Nikka Grand 50ml bottled in the1970's.



The next row shows a 15yo, 100ml

Suntory bottle that sold for £75 followed by Suntory White Label 7 Year Old Bottle from the Hakushu Distillery in the 1980's. It is 50ml and sold for £40. The next bottles is remaining anonymous, unless you read Japanese that is! It is a Suntory Tarudashi Gensyu bottled in a 50ml bottle in the1990's. There were two of these for sale individually and they both

fetched £85. The final bottle in this row was probably the cheapest Japanese whisky in the auction. Just £6 bought the 50ml Nikka Mild Whisky from the 1980s. Our final Japanese whisky was sold on it's side with the neck sticking out of the box. It is a 50ml Suntory Reserve Genshu. This one sold for £65.

I also added Straight bottles from Peru.



Whiskies from Ireland have seen a big revival in the last few years and this is shown in the price that the miniatures fetch, as well as both the quality and quantity of the full size bottles sold.

We start off with the two on the right. They are the only two not bottled in the Irish Republic. Dunvilles is from Belfast, probably in the 1920's or 30's. It is about 50ml and sold for  $\pounds$ 145. Kilkenny was bottled by Garnetts Wine & Spirit Merchants of Rotherham, England. It is about 7cl and probably dates from the 1950's.  $\pounds$ 18 seemed cheap.



Also cheap was Scot Erin's Isle Irish Whiskey 5cl which sold for a mere  $\pounds$ 5. Alex Findlater & Co. Best Old Irish Whiskey is another probably 1950's bottle and another about 7cl -  $\pounds$ 40.

The Redbreast were the two top Irish Whisky sellers. The 20 Year Old Dream Cask Pedro Ximenez Edition, a 10cl Press Sample, sold for £210. The 32 Year Old Dream Cask, another 10cl Press Sample, fetched £330.

Finally on this page we have the last of the Irish Whiskies. This is the Tullamore Dew Discovery Collection, 3x5cl minis, from a company owned by Wm. Grant & Sons of Scotland. They are Cider Cask, Phoenix and the third one merely says Irish Whisky. £50 bought the set.

I believe the poorest result in the auction must have been the above at only £20 for the set. This is the Bimber Distillery London Single Malt Spirit Collection. This is basically English whisky that cannot be called whisky because it is not 3 years old.

One surprise at this auction was that some poor/very poor bottles fetched high prices.

The Gilbey's Bond 7 is from Australia. The auction people say it is 1940's but I think it is later than that. It is a 1 fluid ounce (about 28ml) bottle. It sold for £80 – not a mistake! Another Aussie whisky is Gilt Edge. This is a 2 2/3 fl.oz. (47ml) bottle from the 1960's or 70's. It only fetched £12,



which still seems high to me for a bottle in this condition. 45 and SS Pierce Number 6 sold together. 45 is Australian and 6 is US. £45 bought the pair.

I'm not going to bother showing the pics but three different New Zealand 45 South minis, all in better condition than any of the above, went for £6. Three different Wilson's New Zealand whiskies and a Dunbar New Zealand whisky went for £7, again, all in better condition than the bottles above.

On the next page we have a diverse range of minis, most of which sold relatively cheaply.



I made the mistake of not looking through this auction until it had ended. It is rare for them to have anything I want and then they tend to go high as others want them too. This Bols piece is The Poacher from 1954. It was made by Royal Dalton and sold for a mere £14.

The three Vlahov liqueurs are from the 1960's and in lovely condition. They also sold for £14.

The three Martini Vermoths are Italian, in good condition and from the 1950's. £24.

The three Copper & Kings Absinthes were a disappointment at only £8 for the three.







Another disappointment was very nice Opihr Oriental Spiced London Dry Gin from England. There were two on sale, one sold £5 and the other for £3

The two Eight Lands are 10cl Gin & Vodka distilled at the Glenrinnes distillery in Scotland. The pair sold for £16, which sounds about right.

Murphy's Liqueur Scotch Whisky is about 50ml. It was bottled in Northern Ireland. A mere £5 bought it. Woodford Reserve is a well known, and good, Bourbon but these teo bottles are Bitters from the same company. 10cl each and £4 each.

Peter Bonkovich sent us this photo. It is five buildings from the Air New Zealand Colonial Collection. These were sold on 1<sup>st</sup> June by Corby's Auctions of

> Auckland for NZ\$320 + GST (\$368 total). There was a time when one of these may have sold for that much but this figure is much more realistic, although still on the high side in today's market.

Price US\$15.00 - Postage US\$24.47 - plus Import Charges US\$8.07

# KING CAR DISTILLERY

Thanks to fellow club member Hugo Nami I am the proud owner of 10 single malt whiskies from this Taiwan distillery. When a connoisseur like Hugo says these beautiful bottles need to be better known, who am I to argue.



The King Car distillery was built in 2005 and the name roughly translates as to Drive Wealth. The name is very apt as the founder Lee Tien-Tsa and his son Albert run a large and successful food and drink empire.

In 1995 they wished to enter the alcohol business and build their own distillery. However the Taiwan government had a monopoly on the alcohol production business and did not want to share it. The result was 10 years of arguments. Two factors led to a solution. The first was in 2002 when Taiwan joined the World Trade Organisation. The WTO do not allow governments to have a monopoly. The second was that King Car stated they would only produce single malt whiskies. Permission was finally granted and, after taking only 8 months to build, the distillery opened in 2005.

The first whisky was bottled in 2008. This may appear to be a short time but the heat in Taiwan speeds up the maturation. A whisky that takes 12 years to mature in Scotland only takes 6 in Taiwan. The climate also has an adverse side in that it is party time for the angels, with the angels share being 15% per annum.

At first the whisky was only sold locally but exports started in 2012. It is now available in over 20 countries (including New Zealand) and whisky commentators have been kind in their comments. They have also won numerous



international awards. In one blind tasting, held in Scotland on Burns Night, it came ahead of 3 Scottish single malts.

The bottles are all glass and 50ml. There are 3 shapes that I know of, plus tube bottles. The standard round bottle is fractionally taller than its Scottish counterpart. The



oblong one is based on the shape of taiwan's tallest building. The shoulder is slightly wider than the base. The bottle is made of thick glass with 3 ridges down each side. The front and back are even. A quality bottle deserving a place in any collection. The third shape needs no introduction as it is based on a copper still.

As for the contents, there are over 20 variations on the market. Most of the early ones were aged in Bourbon casks but nowadays wine, port and sherry casks are used. Thankfully for us collectors all come out in miniature. A few of the whiskies are bottled under the King Car label but most appear under the Ka Va Lan name (also spelt KAVALAN). This name comes from the indiginous tribe that used to roam the nearby plains.

Taiwan and nearby China are increasingly becoming important factors in the whisky world. The King Car distillery receives over 1 million visitors per annum. That is more than all the Scottish distilleries combined! So why not show your appreciation to the Lees and add a bottle or two to your collection.
